#### Bluebell has a new kitchen!


This will make a huge difference for all of the staff making breakfast and OOSC meals for the many hungry children. Over the past 12 months focus has been on how we can provide a wide variety of meals whilst making sure they are also healthy and something the children would like to eat. The feedback from both parents and children has been wonderful. It is nice to know that the hard work put into menu choices and preparing meals is welcomed and that the children are happy to attend.

#### **Online Tracker System**

Everyone within Shadwell Childcare works relentlessly to ensure that all children within our care are given every opportunity to achieve their very best. We continually review our processes, learning objectives and moderations systems to ensure that learning is fun and lead by the child's interests. The changes made over the last 12 months were recognised when we were awarded Outstanding by Ofsted. This is something that we are very proud of although we acknowledge that the hard work does not stop there.

To enable us to continue moving forward we have purchased a Tracker System. The innovative Tracker App enables EYFS development observations to be made from a tablet, producing comprehensive learning journals. It enables staff to capture photographs, tag the relevant EYFS / CoEL for each individual child and then enables us to track progress and produce analytical reports for all areas of learning. The staff have been using the system throughout December to familiarise themselves and we continue to input and update each child's details.

I will be in touch with user instructions as soon as we are ready to go live and send out user details. In the meantime the staff will continue to complete the children's learning profiles to the same exceptionally high standard.





### Sound and Maths Box



Each week we will continue to focus on a key sound from the alphabet to enhance our phonics.

The letter order will be emailed for the upcoming term and displayed in the cloakroom. Children are encouraged to bring an object to nursery that begins with that phonetic sound; for example;

'A' could be Apple or Ant (but not A as in Angel)

From this term we will also be introducing a Maths box. For Sunflower this will include numbers up to 5 as well as recognising colours and shapes. Bluebell will focus on the next stages including numbers to 10 in stages understanding what makes each number as well as number bonds and focus on patterns

Many children within our setting can count to high numbers however the focus has now returned to basics for all maths areas. Children are required to recognise, say each number, count, write and understand each number, shape or colour with confidence before moving to the next stages.

Children are encouraged to bring in any item that supports this learning for example a photo of your house number, a circle toy or coloured piece of material. Anything that helps them recognise the object and current learning objective.

#### Funding update

#### 15 hours

All children aged 3 and 4 years are entitled to 15 hours funded childcare from the term after they turn 3 years old. The spring term covers January - March. We automatically apply for your funding with LCC and a parents contract will be raised for you to check and sign. You will be asked to sign a funding form this week if your child is eligible. The funding is automatically deduced from your invoice so please let the office know if you think this is incorrect or missing. Please advise the office immediately if your child shares funding with another setting or child minder.

#### 30 hours

Many families are able to receive 30 hours funded childcare where eligible. Please see <a href="https://www.childcarechoices.co.uk">www.childcarechoices.co.uk</a> for further information. Where funding is applicable it is the <a href="https://parents' responsibility">parents' responsibility</a> to apply for the funding every 3 months. Should you not renew your 11 digit code you will be eligible for the full nursery charges for that term. Shadwell Childcare will complete a parent's contract on your behalf which you will be required to sign.

Please note that whilst we offer 30 hour funding to all we cannot guarantee we have 30 hours available due to capacity. If you are wishing to increase your hours please speak with the office to check for availability.

If you have any questions on your invoice or funding please email or speak to me and I will be happy to help.

#### Holiday Clubs and Year-Round bookings

Attached is the Year-Round booking form which will reserve your child a place in all holiday clubs throughout the year and therefore guaranteeing your sessions for 50 week-a-year.

If you do not wish to book year-round sessions you will only have your sessions booked for term time (38 weeks). You can continue to complete the holiday booking form for each half term as it is released and places will be allocated on a first come first served basis. We cannot guarantee a place for holiday club unless you use the year round booking form.

Please note that we are closed bank holidays, the week between Christmas and New Year and also the week of August bank holiday where we have training and a full nursery deep clean. Term dates are on the noticeboards and available on the website.

### Learning objectives in Sunflower Room term....


# We are going to learn lots about shapes and colours this half term
